Demonstrating their commitment to repairing individual homes and renewing entire neighborhoods, Rebuilding Together, the nation's leading nonprofit organization working to preserve affordable homeownership and revitalize communities, will lead a two-day community revitalization effort in the Como neighborhood of St. Paul, MN. Over 100 Lowe's employees from around the region will volunteer on May 1st & 2nd to provide critical home repairs, accessibility modifications and other safety improvements for four homes owned by families in need.

In addition, Rebuilding Together and Lowe's will partner with Carter's Kids to build a brand new playground for the students of Chelsea Heights Elementary School.
