# Gratitude Report

## In 2022, we celebrated 25 years since our founding!

Reflecting on this milestone, we look back with pride on the growth of our organization and the impact we have made since our founding.

We helped our first homeowners in 1998, serving four families in Minneapolis and Saint Paul; and last year, we preserved affordable homeownership and addressed health and safety hazards at 285 homes across Minnesota, directly impacting the well-being of 392 low-income residents. Since our founding in 1997, we have repaired 1,631 homes, an average of at least one home each and every week. Over the years we have expanded our work to include revitalization and improvements to 83 community spaces which includes six nonprofit facilities and community spaces from this year alone; enriching communities and growing our impact.

In addition to this historic impact, 2022 marked our continued expansion into Southwest Minnesota, adding Murray and Pipestone Counties to our existing Southwest service area of Cottonwood, Jackson, and Nobles Counties. This year, the Southwest service area supported 28 low-income households.

This work would not be possible without the generosity of our supporters, and the steadfast dedication of our volunteers! This year we partnered with 573 volunteers to complete these projects, and who collectively gave 4,033 hours of their time to support those in need across their communities; equivalent to the work of two full time employees.

We are grateful to everyone who supported our work in 2022. This celebration of 25 years of impactful service to the state we call home is shared with you all. As we look to the future, we continue to strategically expand into areas of need, deepen our connections with communities across Minnesota, and support those most in need with repairs and modifications to their homes. Together, we will ensure all of our neighbors have a safe and healthy place to call home!

## Voices from home

#### Diondra

This year, we supported people like Diondra, who shares her manufactured home with her partner and their three children. The family came to Rebuilding Together Minnesota in danger of eviction because they could not afford to fix the siding. During our intake process we discovered that their furnace and air conditioning also needed to be repaired. The family had been relying on costly space heaters and portable air conditioning units as one of their daughters has a medical condition that causes her to faint if she gets overheated.

## With the support of our volunteers we installed new siding and replaced the furnace and air conditioning.

This ensured stable housing for Diondra's family, reduced their energy bills, and directly improved the health and well-being of their daughter.



#### Brian

We also supported veteran homeowners like Brian. A veteran of the Air Force, he and his wife Linda, have been struggling to keep up with home repairs since Brian lost his lower legs. Active in the community, Brian regularly volunteers as a mentor for veterans from the conflicts



in the Middle East, providing friendship and teaching them how to work with stained glass (one of his personal passions).

The work we completed on their Dayton's Bluff home, will alleviate stress for Brian and Linda and ensure their home is well-maintained for years to come.

#### Mary

Greater Minnesota homeowners like Mary have been served through our growing Southwest office. Mary is a single mother of four who recently lost her mother after a battle with cancer. When a water heater replacement revealed a broken sump pump, basement flooding, and missing smoke detectors – the projects kept piling up.



With the help of area volunteers including the local high school football team; the community rallied to support Mary and her children, ensuring they are able to live safely and build generational wealth within the community they love.



#### Juxtaposition Arts

This past year, Rebuilding Together Minnesota was proud to support communities through repairs and improvements in community centers such as Juxtaposition Arts. We were contacted by Juxtaposition to support them with painting their new building in North Minneapolis which will expand their service offerings and double their program capacity.





All of our homeowners are well below the area median income (AMI). For a family of four in the Twin Cities, this means a household income of less than \$62,100 per year.


